

# Collaborating to Heal Addiction and Mental health in Primary care (CHAMP) Strategies to Increase Patients Eligible for CHAMP

### Patients Diagnosed with OUD or Provider Concerned about OUD use

- Provider has clinical concern about patient with OUD and/or MHD symptoms
- Patients must be screened with the NMA but do not need to screen positive
- Patients still need to meet the criteria for OUD could include patients in remission
  - Note many of these criteria can be observed and do not rely on patient reporting but rather clinical judgement - (2 of the 11 criteria met in the last 12 months)
- Patients still need to meet MHD screening parameters
- Potential patients to consider:
  - o Patient on mOUD that are not completely stable but no longer screen positive on NMA
  - o Patients on mOUD that still have significant anxiety, depression, or PTSD symptoms
  - Patients taking prescribed opioids that meet criteria for OUD and have MHD symptoms

## **Patients with Lower Eligibility Scores on the Mental Health Screeners**

We have lowered the eligibility criteria for MHD symptoms:

PHQ9: 5 or greaterGAD7: 5 or greaterPTSD-PC: 1 or greater

- Potential patients to consider:
  - o Patients with OUD and even mild symptoms of depression, anxiety or PTSD

## **Patients Identified through Targeted Screening**

- Consider specifically screening targeted higher risk populations:
  - o Patients with opioid prescription
  - Patients with evidence of injection drug use
  - o Patients with prior OUD, depression, anxiety or PTSD diagnosis
  - Patients recent hospitalized with issues related to chronic pain or OUD
  - o Patient with emergency department visit that is OUD related
  - Patients engaged in substance use disorder support groups
  - o Patients with a tobacco use disorder
  - Patient with an alcohol use disorder
  - Patients with hepatitis C
