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

Environment of disclosure

• Creating a safe space to discuss OUD
• Placing OUD in a biomedical context, like any other comorbidity


• Normalize treatment

• Normalize discretion a patient's opioid use history
• Setting expectations for how treatment will unfold

• Offering multiple communication avenues and modalities
• Outreaching to patients informally, just to check in
